SEND Code of Practice [2015] definition

This was shared with the group and it was noted how brief it is for such an important subject.

DfE Mental Health and Behaviour in schools [March 2016]

Mrs Tarrant-Blick handed out the DfE guidance document for mental health in school and she highlighted certain sections for groups to read and discuss.

Discussions centred on:

- The pressures on children and young people - social because of social media and academic as standards now seemed so high.
- The importance of allowing children freedom - playing outside, exploring, climbing trees, getting dirty.
- How the Forest School model could prove useful.
- Transitions - (YR-Y1, Y2-Y3, Y6-Y7, preschool-YR) and the pressures they can cause.

**Mainstream Core Standards for Social, Emotional and mental Health Needs and
Woodlands menu of strategies, resources and interventions**

The group looked at the variety of strategies, resources and interventions that were in place across the school and thought that they were extremely comprehensive.

Actions:

- Continue to think about the key transitions and how to manage the children's social and emotional health during these times. Ensure good preparation for physical changes and routines.
- Investigate the Forest School approach (Sam Clarke and Mrs Priestley to meet)
- Ensure all interventions are communicated to parents.
- Ensure children are clear about who to approach if they are feeling vulnerable - through class discussions and assemblies.
