Last Friday, I received a lovely email from Miss Gould:



'How gorgeous is this? Carys worked on this at home to share as part of her speaking and listening project. 'I thought it would make you all smile!!' It certainly did!

Also last Friday, Year 3 went on a trip to see the river Darent in the village of Horton Kirby. The children were very excited to see Mr Berry again, who taught them about how a river

starts, flows and ends. The children measured the flow of the river using Pooh sticks, the speed of the river using stopwatches and learnt about how pollution is affecting the

sediment. They also tested the permeability of rocks and learnt about how flood barriers can protect houses from the risk of flooding. The Year 3 team would like to say a massive thank you to all their volunteers who made the day as wonderful as it was.

This week, in Year 1 the children have been looking at how different materials feel. They have been using words such as rough, smooth, soft and hard to describe a range of objects.

In Year 2, the children planted radish seeds in the KS2 garden to observe them growing. They were wondering if any children could find more seeds at home from the fruit and vegetables



that they eat. They would love to see them in school.

Miss Nair wanted to share this picture of posters made by some Elder children for Earth Day. They put in a lot

of effort and creativity into their work, highlighting their care for the planet.

In PSHE, Year 3 has been discussing gender roles. Children shared who does which jobs in their own

houses. The children decided that both men and women are capable of doing the same jobs around the house. Our piles changed from

men and women only jobs to gender neutral for all of them by the end of the lesson!







Since the beginning of term, Year 4 has been challenged with creating their own limericks: trying to make them funny and correctly rhyming them and following the rhyming pattern. This gave the students and the adults great joy in reading and writing them.
