



Diversity means that there are many different types of people in the world.

Diversity

Diversity is about how different and varied things are in the world, such as living things, landscapes and climates.

In Year 3 PSHE, children learn about how everyone's family is different.

In Year 6 Science, children learn about how evolution has shaped different species of animals.

In Year 1 Science, children learn about some common wild and garden plants.

In Year 1 Science, children learn about a variety of food chains and the different ways energy is transferred.

In Year 2 Geography, pupils learn about the different climate in Australia.

In Year 5 Geography, children learn all about volcanoes.

In Year 5 Music, children learn how to play African Djembe drums.

In Year 6 RE, children compare and make connections between beliefs and behaviour in different religions specifically looking at Ahimsa, Grace and Ummah.

In Year 2 Art, children study and recreate Aboriginal art.

In Year 4 RE, children study what it means to be a Muslim in Britain today.

In RE, children learn about the different religious festivals of the world e.g. Year 1 – Easter, Year 2 Passover, Year 4 Eid.

In Year 1, children read books celebrating different cultures including Anansi the Spider and Handa's Hen.

Culture

Culture is about caring and knowing about art, writing and music from around the world.

Culture is the customs and ways of living of different people.

In Year R PSHE, children learn to describe why their home is special to them.

In Year 5 PSHE, children learn to give examples of people in our country who lead different lives to them.

In Year 6 French, children learn the words for typical items of food eaten in France.

In History lessons, we look back to how different people lived in the past e.g. Stone Age people in Year 3 and Vikings in Year 4.
