Another busy week for the pupils of Woodlands Primary School....



On Monday, a TV crew came in from Sky Kids in collaboration with the FYI First News newspaper. The interviews with some of our older pupils were about attitudes to reading. The children did a great job – full of confidence and an obvious love of reading. At the moment, we do not know when the different segments will be aired and we cannot promise that all children will actually feature in the show. However, I think you would agree that this is a great experience for children to see behind the lens of a news programme.

Year 2 visited the Methodist church as part of their RE topic. We welcome Reverend Kirsty to the area, following the departure of Reverend Sharon.

While in Year 3, the children have been making different types of rocks from chocolate and comparing them. Messy but fun!

Our assemblies focused on our core vale of respect and explored the impact on others of not looking after school property and the school site. In KS2, we looked at: How can we play

football if the ball has been kicked over the hedge and left there? How can we complete a drawing if the tools we use are broken or worn down? How do we find information in a book if the books have not been put back in the right place?

Next week, we will be celebrating harvest. Please send in any goods for FEAST food bank. We are also looking forward to inviting leaders from local schools to review our SEND provision. This last year, we have been part of a peer review programme, and have helped other local schools assess their SEND provision and reflect on how it can be improved. This has been very helpful in having 'fresh eyes' from outside. We look forward to our turn, as part of constant processes to develop and improve our practice for all pupils.

We have also been looking at exciting projects within the school to further improve teaching and learning. I will be sharing these with you in the coming weeks. Our School Improvement Advisor, from the local authority, visited in July. He was really pleased with the plans and actions of leaders and staff and summarised with: 'The school has an accurate view of its overall effectiveness and is on an upward trajectory.' This confirms our desire, as always, to be 'even better' from a solid starting position.
