Here is a whistle-stop tour of learning this week:

In Year 1, the children have been looking at the how the seasons affect leaves and also gaining a better understanding of North, South, East and West.

Year 2 teachers have been very impressed by the hard work and preparation that has gone into their speaking and listening tasks this week. This really is a fabulous way of building language and confidence.

In Year 3, the children have been learning about wishing tales – their structure and use of vocabulary.

Year 4 has been looking at suspense stories and what makes them suspenseful. Earlier in the week, they created story maps of a new character in their book Varjak Paw and were acting out and reciting the story to help them to remember the sequence.

Year 5 pupils have been making planets and learning how the Earth is not a perfect sphere due to gravity and rotation.

In Year 6, they have been learning about the Battle of Dunkirk and using this as inspiration for Ottava Rima poems (for those interested parties: a form of poetry consisting of stanzas of eight lines of ten or eleven syllables, rhyming abababcc!)

The children have also been creating their Christmas cards ready to share with parents in the not-too-distant future.

I have been asked by a Year 6 pupil if we can have a joke of the week for the newsletter, so if your child has a good one, please ask them to write it down with their name and class and pass it to me.

The weekend is meant to be a humdinger weather-wise so do enjoy the warmth while it is still with us.
