During our recent half-term trip to America to visit family in Michigan, we took Reuben to the Henry Ford Museum where, as well as all the cars and displays of technology and innovation, we knew there

was a significant exhibition covering the fight for social justice in America. One of those exhibits is the bus in which Rosa Parks was riding in 1955 when she made her stand for civil rights. Reuben was very keen to sit inside and listen to a recording, narrated by Rosa Parks, setting out the background and events of the day.

Thanks to your teaching, Reuben was able [and keen!] to ask the guide many questions and it was a real highlight of our trip.'
