The children really enjoyed British Science week last week and impressed the teachers with their 'working scientifically' skills.



We posed the question: which biscuit is the best for dunking in our tea? (We are sure that just like us you will be very interested in the results!)

The children took their roles as biscuit dunkers very seriously and took time to ensure that they conducted a fair test. They thought carefully about the science involved asking questions such as: Is the liquid absorbed into the biscuit? Is the biscuit eroding or is it dissolving? If it is dissolving, what ingredient is dissolving and why?

The best biscuit, with a whopping 18 dunks, was the
