Welcome back to the summer term – an exciting, very busy time of the year!

Year 1 has been tasting some of the food they read about in 'Handa's Surprise'. Some of the fruit was a hit...others not as much!

Year 2 has been exploring how pollution affects the sea. They have written very enthusiastically about how they feel and what they would like to do about it.







Year 3 has been getting ready for their trip to the river at Horton Kirby on today. They began their art topic 'River Journeys' by looking at where the river goes in Tonbridge. They thought about where they could see the river in town and came up with: Tonbridge Park, the High Street and Haysden lake. Can you think of any other places you can see a river in Tonbridge?

Below is a piece of art work created by Theo in Year 3. He was deeply inspired by the book "A River" and particularly the

llustrations by the award-winning Illustrator Marc Martin. It was truly heartening to see the impact of creative work on young minds.

Year 4 has been working hard with tenths and hundredths this week. They have worked on equivalent fractions and decimals. These lessons have included various activities and a variety of depictions so that the children can become comfortable with different ways of approaching these types of questions. This should give the children a good start when we move on to decimals later in the year.

They have also begun their topic on mountains and have been looking at where they are in the world and famous expeditions that have reached the summit of Mount Everest.

Year 5 have been very busy making their stuffed toys as part of their DT projects, which have all been

carefully designed and stitched. They also thought about what kind of appliqués they can use and how to stitch these on effectively. These are just a few of their fantastic products!

Thank you to those parents in Year R to 3 who responded to our question about the Year 5 residential. The overwhelming majority would like to keep this in place. As long as we can financially support that, it will remain in place. I do suggest parents in Year 3 start to chip away at the costs for the Year 5 and 6 residentials. We are doing all we can to keep prices down but the coaches and providers have significantly raised prices in the last two years so we will have to keep monitoring this.
